TOPIC: “Looking for a place to eat”






Duration: 10 minutes

- Scenario 1: There are two people (male and female) looking for a place to eat. They are torn between a restaurant or a bar.
 - Dialogue (with audio)
 - Add a vocabulary section

- Scenario 2: Inside the restaurant or the bar (with audio) - The dialogue will be dependent if they choose to go to the restaurant or the bar.
 - The waiter greets and asks for how many people
 - The waiter will guide them to their table and give them the menu
 - Arabic, Chinese, and Japanese menu with the amount in its proper currency per country
 - Ordering food and drinks
 - Asking for the bill
 - Issuing the receipt
